



Common Name	Cultivar	Height	Harvest	Description
Almond	'Hall's Hardy'	15'-20'	Fall	Medium sized hard-shelled almond, with a delicious sweet kernel. The tree has beautiful, profuse pink blooms; is a heavy bearer, and very cold hardy. Needs a pollinizer. Requires 800 chill hours, ripens in October.
Almond	'Texas Mission'	10'-15'	Fall	The small-to-medium sized tree with a spreading, open canopy usually grows 10-15 ft. It has a showy white bloom which produces a wonderfully sweet nut. The Texas Mission needs a pollinizer. Requires at least 500 chill hours.
Apple	'Holland'	15'-20'	September	Large fruit with red skin. Firm, sweet juicy flesh good for eating. Self-fertile, increase yields with a polinator. 500 chilling hours.
Apple	'Winesap'	12' - 20'	Oct. to Dec.	A large to medium sized apple with a dull red skin. Crisp texture and a tart-wine flavor. Fruit ripens for harvest in the fall. Best with 400 chilling hours. Needs a pollinator.
Apple	'Granny Smith'	20'-30'	Aug.-Sept.	Large fruit with bright green skin and firm, sweet flesh that makes this apple good for eating and cooking. Favored for salads because the slices do not brown as quickly as other varieties. Semi-self fertile, good pollinator for other varieties. 400 chilling hours.
Apple	'Mollie's Delicious'	20'-30'	Late July	Very large apple with light yellow skin that has a red blush. Firm, juicy yellow flesh is sweet, mild and crisp. Excellent quality and stores well. Tolerates heat and humidity. Pollinator recommended (Granny Smith). 400 chilling hours.
Apple	'Gala'	15'-20'	September	Beautiful, small fruit striped red-orange on golden yellow. Slightly grainy, crisp, and sweetly tart flesh with excellent flavor for fresh eating. Delicious sliced in salads and in sandwiches. Needs a pollinator. 550 chilling hours.
Apricot	'Royal'	15'-20'	Summer	All-purpose freestone, sweet, aromatic, flavorful fruit. Late June harvest. Estimated chill requirement: 400 hours . Self-fruitful.
Apricot	'Moorpark'	20'-30'	June-July	Medium to large, brownish-red skin with firm, brightly colored flesh. Fruit is juicy and sweet. Good for pies, eating and preserves. Can be pruned to 15'. Self-fertile. 600-700 chilling hours.
Blueberry	'Tifblue'	8'-10'	July	Dependable production with a large, light blue, flavorful berry. Cold hardy. Also wonderful as an ornamental hedge. Requires a pollinator. Chilling hours 550-750 hours.
Blueberry	'Powder Blue'	8"-10"	June-August	Berries are powdery blue in color. Plants have vigorous upright growth. May be pollinated with Tiffblue. This will increase their pollination. Berries are medium sized and light blue in color and have good firmness. 550-650 chilling hours.
Cherry	'Stella'	15'-20'	Summer	Stella is a large, dark red cherry with firm, sweet, dark red flesh. It is resistant to cracking, bears at a young age, and is self-fertile. Stella is a good pollinizer for all sweet cherries, and ripens in mid-July; requires 700 to 800 chill hours and is self-fertile.
Cherry	'Rainier'	15'-20'	June - July	Rainier is a large, yellow cherry with a red blush and light yellow flesh. Excellent flavor. Rainier requires a pollinator. Chilling requirement is 700 hours.
Cherry	'North Star Dwarf'	8'-10'	June - July	The Dwarf North Star is a medium sized bright red to mahogany skinned sour cherry, with red, juicy tender flesh. This attractive tree is naturally small and can be used in containers. Self-fertile, 800 chilling hours.
Fig	'Celeste'	15'-20'	June	Produces many small to medium-sized figs that ripen to green flushed with violet with white flesh that's firm, juicy and very sweet. Most cold hardy fig. Good preserved and fresh. Figs are self fertile.
Fig	'Brown Turkey'	15'-20'	June	Medium to large fruit with purplish-brown skin. Rich amber-pink flesh. Reliably good, sweet flavor, and outstanding hardiness. Best eaten fresh. Produces fruit late spring and late summer. Figs are self fertile.
Fig	'Texas Everbearing'	15'-20'	Late June	Fruit is medium-sized and bell shaped with light brown skin. Nearly seedless fruit, with ambe flesh and a mild, sweet flavor. Shrubby growth. Pollination not required.

Common Name	Cultivar	Height	Harvest	Description
Grape	'Carlos Muscadine'	20'-30'	Summer	The Carlos Muscadine is self-fertile with a medium sized good quality bronze colored fruit. Ripens early-mid season. It leaves a clean scar on the fruit and is very productive. Excellent for making wine.
Grape	'Coward Muscadine'	20'-30'	Summer	The Coward Muscadine is a black grape with an excellent flavor. The vine is very vigorous and produces many large clusters of medium size fruit. Ripens early season.
Grape	'Triumph Muscadine'	20'-30'	Summer	An older self-pollinating variety that is valued for fresh eating and wine. The fruit are large, thin skinned and greenish-bronze, with a high sugar content. Triumph's vines are very winter hardy, productive, self-pollinating and excellent pollinators for other female varieties. Ripens early-mid season.
Grape	'Black Spanish'	4'-6'	July-August	Large clusters with small, black, seeded berries. Very vigorous, hardy, disease resistant grapes perfect for making red wine, jelly and juice. Thin skinned, dark purple grape with tender, juicy flesh. Heavily productive vines ripen late July-early August. Performs well in Dallas. Requires 150-200 chilling hours.
Grape	'Champanel'	4'-6'	July	Extremely well adapted to Texas. Dark seeded grapes are excellent eaten fresh or made into wine. These ripen early. Require 150-200 chilling hours.
Olive	'Arbequina'	15'-20'	November	The Arbequina Olive tree rates high among olive connoisseurs because of its small size, good resistance to frosts and a high adaptability to different climates and soils (including poor ones).
Peach	'Redskin'	15'-20'	August	Large, red freestone with yellow flesh. Good for eating, shipping and canning. Self fertile. 750 chilling hours.
Peach	'Ranger'	15'-20'	Mid-June	Large, bright red-skinned freestone with sweet, yellow flesh. Very cold hardy and must be thinned to ensure large fruit. Fragrant pink flowers in spring. Self fertile. 800 chilling hours.
Peach	'June Gold Dwarf'	10'-15'	Summer	Large, firm, yellow-fleshed fruit is red-skinned & semi-freestone when fully ripe. Long-time leader in the Texas fresh-fruit markets. Moderate chilling requirement, about 600 hours. Self-fruitful. June harvest.
Peach	'June Gold'	15'-20'	May-June	Heavy bearer of semi-freestone peaches. Juicy, golden fruit is perfect for eating out-of-hand. 600 chilling hours.
Peach	'Sentinel'	15'-20'	Summer	Sentinel is a large, semi-free stone peach. Requires 850 chill hours. Ripens in early June.
Peach	'Bonfire'	6'	Summer	Bonfire is a genetic dwarf, growing to only 6 feet, with showy flowers and reddish new foliage. The fruit is large, freestone with orange-red skin and sweet yellow flesh. Excellent planted in large containers. Midseason bearing; requires 250 chill hours.
Peach	'Belle of Georgia'	15'-20'	Summer	Combines good yields, hardiness and disease resistance. Sets rosy freestone peaches with juicy white flesh. Ripens in August. Self-pollinating. Requires 800 chilling hours.
Peach	'Redskin Dwarf'	10'-15'	Summer	Excellent quality all-purpose large yellow freestone peach. Ripens in August. 750 hours. Self fruitful.
Peach	'Belle of Georgia Dwarf'	10'-15'	Summer	This large white meat peach is a very heavy producer. Flavorful peaches are freestone. Belle of Georgia will ripen in August, and requires 800 chill hours.
Peach	'Bonanza'	4'-6'	Summer	A true dwarf, making it easily accessible to pruning, spraying and harvesting of full sized fruit. Full size yellow and red skinned fruit with yellow freestone flesh ripens mid to late June. 250 chill hours.
Pear	'Le Conte'	15'-20'	Summer	Good dessert quality, medium-size, attractive fruit that ripens in August-early September. Requires 800 chill hours.
Pear	'Ayers'	10'-15'	Summer	Ayers is an old southern favorite. The fruit are yellow with a red blush. The flesh is smooth and melting with a very sweet flavor. The tree is vigorous, upright and fire blight resistant. The blooms are partially self-pollinating, but better crops will develop with a pollinator. Ripens late July to early Aug. Requires 800 chill hours.
Pear	'Kieffer'	15'-20'	Sept/Oct.	Medium to large fruit. Its gritty texture makes it perfect for canning and cooking. High tolerance to heat and cold, disease resistant and long lived. 300 - 400 chilling hours.
Pear	'Moonglow'	20'-30'	Early August	Large, brownish-green skin with mild, juicy flesh and little grit. Fireblight resistant. Bears at early age and is self-fertile. An excellent pollinator. 500 chilling hours.

Common Name	Cultivar	Height	Harvest	Description
Pecan	'Mohawk'	40'-60'	Late Sept.	Large and full with a thin shell. Good for yard plantings and mild winter areas. Attractive tree is very vigorous. Semi-self fertile.
Pecan	'Tejas'	40'-60'	Fall	Medium size, thin-shelled, fine flavor. Very vigorous, very precocious, heavy bearing. Densel foliated, attractive tree. Harvest early mid-season. 250 hours. Self-fruitful.
Persimmon	'Hachiya'	20'-30'	November	Large, heart-shaped, seedless fruit with bright orange-red skin. Best cooking quality with an astringent taste. Great ornamental tree that's upright and vigorous. Needs a pollinator.
Persimmon	'Fuyu'	20'-30'	November	Handsome tree with edible fruit and bright fall color. Medium sized persimmons are red with flat cap that ripen in late fall. Non-astringent fruit on a self-fertile tree.
Plum	'Santa Rosa'	10'-15'	June-July	This early season plum is a medium-large, crimson to purplish red, lightly freckled plum with yellow flesh. The fruit is firm, sweet, juicy, and aromatic. Compact vigorous tree. Self pollinating. 450 chilling hours.
Plum	'Stanley'	10'-15'	August	A European freestone plum with deep purple oblong fruits and yellow flesh. Excellent for eating fresh, cooking or canning. Self pollinating. Requires 700 chilling hours.
Plum	'Methley'	10'-15'	Early June	Medium sized, juicy, sweet, red-purple fruit. Excellent fresh and in jams. Beautiful clusters of white flowers in early spring followed by bright green foliage. Self-fertile, can be used as a pollinator. 250 chilling hours.
Plum	'Ozark Premier'	15'-20'	Mid-June	Cold-hardy selection produces red-skinned fruits with juicy, firm, yellow flesh. Excellent for canning, pies, and eating out-of-hand. 800 chilling hours.
