



Common Name <i>Latin Name</i>	Description
Passion Flower 'Orchid' <i>Passiflora alata x caerulea</i>	Large 4" fragrant blooms. A vigorous grower with 3 - 5 lobed leaves. Blooms are typically several shades of light lavender to blue and white.
Passion Flower 'Star of Clevedon' <i>Passiflora 'Amethyst' x caerulea</i>	Beautiful white with blue flowers with dark green 5 lobed foliage. Hardy to 32°F. It won the Royal Horticulture Society certificate of merit in 1991.
Passion Flower 'Constance Elliot' White <i>Passiflora caerulea</i>	One of the hardiest of all species. Three to seven lobed leaves 5"-7" across. Four-inch pure white flowers all summer long. Root hardy to 5°F.
Passion Flower 'Blue Crown' <i>Passiflora caerulea</i>	One of the hardiest of all species. Three to seven lobed leaves 5"-7" across and semi-evergreen. Four inch blue and white flowers all summer long. Root hardy to 5°F.
Passion Flower 'Citrina' <i>Passiflora citrina</i>	Native of the pine hills of central western Honduras. Also called the citrus-yellow passion flower. Leaves are 2 or 3 lobed. Makes a good houseplant when able to provide bright light. Not winter hardy.
Passion Flower 'Red Granadilla' <i>Passiflora coccinea</i>	More oblong, rounded 3 lobed leaves of dark green with huge showy scarlet red flowers in cooler months of spring and fall.
Bat Leafed Passion Flower <i>Passiflora coriacea</i>	Dark green bat wing shaped leaves can reach widths of one foot across. Leaves have pale green or yellow mottling. Small, green-yellow flowers in clusters. Ground seed of this variety is used as an insecticide against cockroaches in Guatemala. 40°F.
Passion Flower 'Purple Granadilla' <i>Passiflora edulis</i>	This is the edible passion vine grown commercially for its aromatic fruit. The fruit can be eaten fresh or processed into drinks and desserts. It has purple and white, 3-inch flowers. It will tolerate temperatures close to 28°F.
Passion Flower 'Love In a Mist' <i>Passiflora foetida</i>	Also called "Corona de Cristo" with pink and white 2" flowers. Buds are encased in feathery bracts. Produces red, edible 1 1/2" fruit. Fuzzy 2"-4" green leaves. A native to South Texas. 40°F
Passion Flower 'Sunburst' <i>Passiflora gilbertiana x jorullensis</i>	Leaves have greenish-cream variegations along main veins which accent the bright orange color of the small flowers. Sepals are greenish yellow. Flowers have a pungent odor. Tropical.
Passion Flower 'May Pop' <i>Passiflora incarnata</i>	The hardiest of all passion flowers it is root hardy to -2°F. Sweet scented lavender and white, 2"-3" flowers. Three lobed 2"-4" dark green leaves. Edible fruit turns yellow when ripe. Native to eastern 1/3 Texas.
Passion Flower 'Incense' <i>Passiflora incarnata x cincinnata</i>	Five lobed 6"-8" dark, glossy green leaves. Large sweetly fragrant violet flowers. Very showy dark violet and white filament. Root hardy to 5° F.
Passion Flower 'Boomerang' <i>Passiflora perfoliata</i>	Purplish/ maroon 2" flowers. Leaves form an open V- shape and are 2"-5" wide. 55°F.
Passion Flower 'Winged Stem' <i>Passiflora phoenicea</i>	Burgundy sepals and petals with thick richly banded filaments. Blooms are 4"-5" across and very fragrant. Glossy green 4"-5" leaves. 35°F.
Three Banded Passion Flower <i>Passiflora trifasciata</i>	Dark green lobed leaves with cream and pink variegation. Fragrant flowers.
Grape Leafed Passion Flower <i>Passiflora vitifolia</i>	Bright scarlet flowers 5"-7" across. Leaves are three lobed and 3"-5" across. 40°F.
Passion Vine 'Amethyst' <i>Passiflora x violacea</i>	This is also called 'Lavender Lady' and has been sold under P. violacea and P. amethystina. Flowers purple to purple blue, 3-4in and bloom all summer or year round in greenhouse. It will take a light frost but is usually winter hardy in the metroplex.
Passion Flower 'Balam' <i>Passiflora xikzodz x coriacea</i>	Dark, shiny green, bat-wing shaped leaves with mottling of light greens and yellow. Unique 1 1/2" light green blooms with black filament.
