The buds and blooms bursting forth after the cold of winter are welcome reminders that this is the season of growth and change; the season in which we get outside, get our hands dirty, and make an impact in our lives.

### **NOW** is the TIME

- selection of varieties we offer at our annual Rose Festival. We open at 7am on Saturday, March 1st!
- Transplants of tomatoes should be planted by March 15th for best success.
- Direct seed lettuces, carrots and radishes. Transplants of peppers, eggplant and tender herbs can be planted after the last average frost. Refer to our 12-month vegetable planting guide for more info.
- Plant fruit trees, ornamental trees, shrubs, roses, perennials, herbs and annual color such as geraniums, petunias, snapdragons, diascia and alyssum.
- **Solution** Use a root stimulator or liquid seaweed on all new plantings every month for the first year.
- No Fertilize your lawn after warm-season grasses are growing and have been mowed 2-3 times. NHG 7-2-2 and 3-2-3 are both great organic fertilizers.
- **>>** Use slug & snail bait or set out beer traps to control these pests.
- Release beneficial nematodes to control ticks, fleas, chiggers, and fire ants.



### Beneficial Insects in the Garden

This year, instead of reaching for chemical insecticides, make some beneficial insects your garden allies. NHG offers several beneficial insect species that you can recruit to help you control garden pests: ladybugs, beneficial nematodes, trichogamma wasps, and praying mantises.

**Ladybugs** in both the larval and adult forms are voracious eaters of aphids and other soft-bodied insects like mites and mealy bugs. Both adults and larvae can consume up to 50 aphids each day and up to 5000 during their lifetime! Release your ladybugs late in the evening; they will be thirsty from their long nap and will appreciate a drink of water when they "wake up."

**Beneficial nematodes** are one of the most common organisms on the planet, and are among my favorites because of the wide range



of pests that they help control—especially fleas and grub worms. To apply nematodes to your garden, you will need a hose-end sprayer or a watering can (even a bucket will do). Simply mix the nematodes with water and apply them to your lawn and garden areas.

**Trichogamma wasps** are among the tiniest insects on the planet—and they don't sting! Their prey includes bagworms, cutworms, cabbage loopers, webworms, tomato hornworms and squash borers, which they use as a host for their eggs and larvae. They are typically sold in the form of eggs attached to a card that you simply attach to trees or any solid surface with a string, needle, or paperclip.

**Praying Mantises** possess a ravenous appetite for almost anything that happens by them. The nymphs and adults are voracious eaters and consume aphids, beetles, leafhoppers, lizards, and many other insects (even lizards and snakes) that are in the area. A praying mantis will patiently stalk its prey for hours before ambushing its victim by impaling it with its spiny legs. Praying mantises come in egg cases that you can insert into the fork of a tree or hang low to the ground with string. Attract beneficial insects to your garden by planting dill, mint, marigolds, sunflowers, fennel, and asters. It's important to provide plants that bloom at different times so that food is always available.
