# Winter is a Great Time to Celebrate (& Select) Indoor Plants!

**The 1st week of November, we're celebrating indoor plants!** Bring the outdoors in during winter months so you can enjoy the beauty and health benefits from your house plants! House plants clean the air naturally and provide a moment of calm from a hectic day.

Most of our favorite houseplants come from tropical climates, so they can tolerate our warm indoors very well. Orchids, bromeliads and ferns love the warmth, but also like it a bit humid. They're from the rainforest after all! Be sure to place a moth orchid **phaleanopsis** by your computer as they counter effect your computer screen's harsh rays. **Ficus** trees, **cactus**, **succulents** and **palms** thrive in **high light** areas and sun porches. A turkey baster is perfect to siphon off the excess water from the saucers! Place your pot and saucer on plant feet to help with air circulation and to protect your floors. We have a great assortment of trivets to choose from. Many different styles and colors! For lower light areas, but not dark, Chinese evergreens and dracaenas do very well and can tolerate a slightly drier soil. If you can read by the light in the room, then you probably have enough light for these wonderful foliage plants. ZZ plant tolerates shade and drought very well. **Spathiphyllums** are also very popular for low light areas and have lovely flowers. **Pothos** and **ivy** are excellent trailing plants. Our organic **BotaniWipes** are great for keeping indoor plant foliage clean, plus they deter indoor pests. When you are ready to repot your plants, use the appropriate potting soil for the type of plant (ie: orchid substrate for orchids, cactus mix for succulents and cactus). Maintaining fresh water in the tree stand reservoir is critical. Fresh cut greens should be soaked in water before putting them up for display, and then misted daily or soaked for an hour or so every other day if that

is possible. The room your greens are in should be kept as cool as possible, with the greens out of the moving air from vents.

# Green Your Garden Year-Round with Evergreen Shrubs

Evergreen shrubs are a cool season classic in the garden. They are the 'bones' for your garden, providing structure and balance when most of your perennials have gone to sleep for the winter. The evergreen shrubs that perform well in Dallas tend to have some common features that include dark-green waxy or glossy foliage, and berries that will attract winter birds. They tend to tolerate shaping well, making them ideal candidates for a formal garden, but also look lovely left to grow in their natural shape. Sizes of the different shrubs are quite variable, ranging from as small as 18" up to 20'. Some of our favorite evergreen shrubs available at NORTH HAVEN GARDENS are holly, nandina, wax myrtle, cleyera, juniper, boxwood, Indian hawthorn, ligustrum, eleagnus, yaupon, Japanese yew, pittosporum, viburnum, camellia, and gardenia. ### Winter Vegetable Display Garden

Winter is my favorite time in the vegetable garden! Plant the right things and you can have a tasty harvest through winter. In our vegetable display garden, we don't cover the plants. The hardiest of our winter crops include collard greens, spinach, carrots, beets, turnips, mustard, kale, broccoli, Brussels sprouts and cabbage. These can go right through most of the freezes that we have here in Dallas with no problem. The crops that are a little less hardy, but still perform well in all but the coldest part of winter are cauliflower, lettuce, onions, Chinese cabbage, radicchio, arugula, radishes, peas and Swiss chard. Evergreen herbs such as rosemary, thyme, oregano and sage all perform well in the winter, and cool season herbs such as parsley, fennel, dill, and cilantro thrive. Check out what's growing in our Vegetable Display Garden each time you visit, it's always changing!

#### NOVEMBER

- O Prepare for Bulb planting by attending Bulb Day November 8th. Free programs on daffodils & tulips.
- O Buy frost cloth to protect tender perennials and other plants from frost and/or freezing.
- O Be certain that plants are mulched well. At least 2 inches of mulch will help protect plant roots from cold temperatures.
- O Select your tulips and hyacinths now. We will pre-chill your bulbs for you in our bulb cooler. Tulips and hyacinth should be planted after Thanksgiving and by the end of December. Plant your daffodils now through mid-January. Mix NHG Organic Bulb Food into soil when planting daffodils.
- O Plant winter color such as pansies, violas, dianthus, snapdragons, flowering kale and cabbage. Finish dividing and re-planting spring and summer-flowering perennials early November. Plant container trees and shrubs.
- O Using a water can, apply a water-soluble fertilizer to newly planted annuals for a quick start.
- O Trim perennials back to the ground as they go dormant. Trim tender perennials such as bananas, firebush, Mexican heather, Mexican bush sage and lantanas after the first freeze, then mulch them well to protect from cold.

#### DECEMBER

- O Mulch the gardens that you missed last month!
- O Remove dead materials that could harbor insects or disease.
- O Plant tulips and hyacinth by the end of the month. Continue planting daffodils. Overplant your bulbs with winter color such as viola and pansy. Primula and cyclamen can be planted in protected garden areas or pots. Apply Bone Meal.
- O Plant container trees and shrubs. Transplanting is best done when plants are dormant.
- O Prune summer-flowering shrubs and vines (such as crape myrtles and altheas) lightly to prevent rampant growth in the spring. Do not prune spring-flowering shrubs (azaleas or hydrangeas), vines, or climbing roses until after their spring bloom.
- O Don't forget to water trees and shrubs.
