# **Fall Lawn Care**

Fall lawn fertilization is important to keep your lawn in the best shape possible through winter. It's important that you select fertilizers higher in potassium that will harden off stems and encourage more root growth, while not encouraging too much green, leafy growth. An organic option is Corn Gluten Meal and Sul-Po-Mag. Corn Gluten Meal acts as a weed suppressant and nitrogen source. Apply between mid-September and October 15th, using 20lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. and water after applying. Sul-Po-Mag promotes good root growth. If you choose to apply a non-organic product, you can apply NHG 21-7-14, a complete fertilizer. Aerating your lawn when you fertilize will help loosen compacted soil and stimulate beneficial microbial activity.

## **PLANTING TIME**

Plant Tulips, Hyacinth and other spring-flowering bulbs between Thanksgiving and the end of December, when soil temperatures reach 45-50°F. Daffodils, however, can be planted anytime after October 1st and through mid-January.

# VEGGIE TIP



September and October are prime planting times for many vegetable varieties. Direct seed Peas (English & edible pod) into the garden and plant transplants of Broccoli, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Chinese Cabbage, Collards, Garlic, and Kohlrabi. # SEPTEMBER

**Plant cool weather color** — petunias, alyssum, dianthus, cyclamen, primrose and flowering kale are just a few options. Plant chrysanthemums in containers for color or anywhere in the garden to perennialize.

**Select and purchase spring-blooming bulbs** mid-September. Shop now for the best selection! New shipments arrive Oct. & Nov.

**Plant beets, carrots, cauliflower, broccoli and cabbage** in September and October! The cooler temperatures often produce heartier and healthier crops than spring plantings. Don't forget to plant cool season herbs!

**Fertilize lawns, trees, roses and shrubs** at the beginning of September. Between mid-September and October 15, apply corn gluten meal to turf as an organic weed pre-emergent in your lawn. Use 20 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. Or, apply a complete fertilizer such as NHG 21-7-14.

# OCTOBER

**Plant cool-season annuals**: mums, snapdragons, dusty miller, fragrant stock, pansies & violas.

If you did not fertilize your lawn in Sept., fertilize now with slow release "winterizing" lawn fertilizer such as NHG 21-7-14 or an organic compost to prepare your lawn for winter.

**Sow** native seeds for spring bloom.
