- 4-6 ears roasted corn
- 1 can black beans, drained & rinsed
- 1 chopped avocado (add just before serving)
- 1 chopped red onion
- handful of cilantro
- red pepper
- jalepenos, salt, black pepper garlic and brown sugar to taste
- chopped green onion
- lime iuice
- 1 chopped tomato
- handful of mint
- soy sauce

Chop and combine all ingredients except avacado. Mix well. Add chopped avocado just before serving.

Plant beets, carrots, cauliflower, broccoli, cabbage and coolseason herbs September and October! The cooler temperatures often produce heartier and healthier crops than spring plantings. Don't forget to plant cool season herbs such as dill, cilantro and parsley.
