NOW is the TIME

- No Fall is the best time to plant (and transplant) trees and shrubs. Cooler temperatures and increased rainfall make for easier maintenance.
- Mulch all new plantings and keep them adequately watered.
- Name Apply pre-emergent weed control to your lawn and flower beds in September.
- **20** Plant cool season color such as snapdragons, petunias, alyssum, dianthus, cyclamen, primrose, ornamental kale, chrysanthemums, marigolds and croton. Pansies & violas can be planted anytime during fall and winter.
- Mend vegetable beds with organic compost before planting.
- Direct seed cool-season vegetables such as carrots, beets, fava beans, spinach and salad greens into the garden. Plant transplants of cauliflower, broccoli, cabbage and Brussels sprouts now through mid-October. Plant cool season herbs such as cilantro, dill, fennel and parsley.
- **100** Plant daffodils, Dutch iris, crocus, grape hyacinth and other hardy bulbs now through January.
- Shop now for pre-chilled tulip bulbs for planting in December.
- Display Fertilize lawns, trees, roses and shrubs with organic NHG 3-2-3 or 7-2-2. For Japanese maples, hydrangeas, peonies and other heavy acid-feeders, apply Espoma Organic Holly-Tone.
- >>> Fertilize herbs and veggies with NHG Organic Herb & Veggie Food.
- **W** Water established plants deeply and infrequently. Established lawns, shrubs and trees will need a deep watering about once per week. Be sure to adhere to local watering restrictions.
- Do not rely on your sprinkler system to adequately water new plantings. Provide supplemental hand watering to new plants as needed.

Invest in a Sweet Harvest

Whether you are a beginning gardener or a seasoned planter, every gardening success—and failure—broadens your experience and builds confidence to



try something new. Thankfully, the cooling weather of fall re-energizes us, and fall is the best time for planting in north Texas.

Build your long-term edible landscape and

Build your long-term edible landscape and celebrate the season by planting a fruit tree! Start by digging a hole twice as wide and no deeper than the root ball. Since a healthy root system will eventually spread far and wide, backfilling with native soil is best and

amending is not recommended. You can, however, make your beneficial soil organisms happy: molasses, which is available in dry and liquid form, provides sugar that feeds these helpful organisms. Medina Soil Activator replenishes micronutrients and helps build soil structure for air and water. Monthly applications of root stimulator are a must, as is a thick layer of mulch.

Beginning late September, we will have a great selection of peaches, apples, persimmons, figs and other favorites—all varieties that we've carefully chosen to succeed in our local climate.

As always, we can assist with selection and advise on pruning, thinning for better harvests and which trees need a pollinating partner.
