From Garden to Table, Plant for Success

Fall is the best time to plant so many plants in north Texas. Milder temperatures and increased rainfall mean that new plants—especially trees and shrubs—can establish root systems much more easily than during hot summer months. Also with the changing season comes the changing of our color plantings: we're in our second 'transitional' color window, with petunias, dianthus, marigolds and ornamental peppers bringing cheerful color ahead of winter's trusted and long-lasting pansies and

In the vegetable garden, the transition is even more dramatic: large-fruited plants such as squash and melons will soon give way to the leafy greens of lettuce, spinach, kales and cole crops such as broccoli, Brussels sprouts and cabbage. These 'nutritional superheroes' are both lovely to look at in beds and containers and also very easy to grow throughout our cool season.

All landscape areas will benefit greatly from a late summer/early fall fertilization. Espoma's Bio-Tone Starter Plus is ideal to jump-start any new plantings. Products such as Garden Soil Builder, a rich source of humates, are highpowered amendments to bring to the garden. Composted manures stimulate microbial activity to make the accompanying nutrients available to plants' roots, which will initiate a heavier growth phase with the coming cool weather. With these, you're not only replacing nutrients lost over the growing season, you're also providing plants with the proper nutrition to flush fall blooms and establish new roots. It's such an important season in the garden!

What to take away from all of this? We at NHG want you to have success with all that you grow, and with an increased focus on the health of your soil and the proper timing of your plantings, you will!
