Apple			
Granny Smith	20'-30'	Aug-Sept	Large bright green fruit has firm, sweet flesh. This apple is good for eating and cooking. Favored for salads because the slices do not brown as quickly as other varieties. Semi-self fertile, good pollinator for other varieties. 400 chill hours.
Mollie's Delicious	20'-30'	Jul-Aug	Very large apple with light yellow skin that has a red blush. Firm, juicy yellow flesh is sweet, mild and crisp. Excellent quality and stores well. Tolerates heat and humidity. Pollinator recommended (Granny Smith). 400 chill hours.
Tangy Green	8'-10'	Sep-Oct	Tangy Green™ Urban Apple® is a lime green apple with a crisp, tart flavor that will bear fruit the first year planted. Matures at 8 to 10 feet tall and 2 feet wide. Two apple varieties are required for pollination. Needs between 800-1200 chill hours.
Tasty Red	8'-10'	Sep-Oct	Tasty Red™ Urban Apple® has bright red apples that are normal size and will bear fruit the first year planted. Matures at 8 to 10 feet tall and 3 to 4 feet wide. Two apple varieties are required for pollination. Needs 800-1200 chill hours.
Blushing Delight	8'-10'	Sep-Oct	Blushing Delight™ Urban Apple® is a narrow, densley branched tree that yields a flush of sweet, reddish green fruits. Good for baking or fresh from the tree. Needs a pollinator and a minimum of 800 + chilling hours.
Ein Shemer	10'-15'	Sep-Oct	A low chill variety with large, pale yellow fruit that has a sight blush when ripe. The apple's sweet, semi-acidic taste is perfect for eating right off the tree or for making into applesauce. 'Ein Shemer' bears fruit at a young age and is very productive. Self fertile. 300-350 chill hours.

Moorpark	15'-20'	Jun-Jul	Medium to large, brownish-red skin with firm, brightly colored flesh. Fruit is juicy and sweet. Good for pies, eating and preserves. Can be pruned to 15'. Self-fertile. 600-700 chill hours.
Goldcot	15'-20'	Jun-Jul	Medium-sized fruit with golden yellow skin and yellow-orange freestone flesh. Juicy, with tangy flavor, used fresh and for freezing and canning. Self-fertile. 600-700chill hours.
Avocado			
Joey	20'-30'	Sep-Oct	Heavy producer of medium-sized, egg-shaped fruit with purple-black skin and excellent flavor. Requires protection from the cold when young. Trunks of young trees susceptible to sunburn.
Lila	20'-30'	Aug-Sep	Lila has medium sized green fruit with a rich nutty flavor, paperthin skins and a high oil content. Ripens from July to September. Evergreen to the mid- to low- 20's, if the bud union is protected. Ripens July- September.
Fantastic	15'-20'	Aug-Sep	Fantastic has dark green, paper thin skin which is edible. The fruit has a creamy texture with a great flavor. A cold hardy variety of avocado that can withstand temperatures into the upper teens once well established. Young trees will need to be protected from frost.
Blackberry			
Apache	5'-8'	May-Jun	A thornless variety with great vigor. Fruit is large with an excellent flavor. Average harvesting season is four weeks starting mid-May. Excellent for jams, jellies and pies. Self-fertile, but benefits from a pollinator. 300 Chill hours.
Arapaho	4'-6'	May	A thornless blackberry variety that has large, firm fruit with small seeds. This is the earliest ripening of Blackberry varieties, beginning in early May. Self-pollinating, but benefits from a pollinator. Arapaho is resistant to Orange Rust. 300 Chill hours.
Prime-Ark Freedom	4'-6'	July	'Prime-Ark Freedom' is a thornless primo-cane blackberry, flowering and fruiting on new canes the first season. Berries are large, firm and very sweet. Where the climate is suitable, it will bear again in the fall. Shows good disease resistance, heat and humidity tolerance. A good choice for the home garden. 350-400 Chill hours.
Natchez	4'-6'	Jun-Jul	A high yielding, thornless blackberry with early season fruits that are large and sweet. This vigorous grower reaches 4 to 5 feet tall and 5 to 6 feet wide. It is disease resistant and tolerant of a wide range of soils. Great for jams, jellies, and pies. Self-fertile. 300 Chill hours.
Kiowa	4'-6'	Jul	Kiowa produces a bounty of very large, firm, high quality berries with a tart yet sweet flavor. Ten berries can fill a half pint container! Excellent for jelly-making and pies. Low Chill requirements--200 hours! Provide good drainage and ample moisture.

Ouachita	4'-6'	Jun-Jul	Produces plump, sweet, pluckable berries on upright thornless canes. This variety shows good disease resistance and heat tolerance. Berries ripen in mid-June.
Brazos	4'-6'	May	Brazos is an erect, thorned blackberry produced by Texas A&M. Its healthy canes produce high yields of large fruit. The acid-flavored fruit is recommended for cooking rather than eating fresh. Harvest in May.
Baby Cakes	3'-4'	July	Baby Cakes™ is an exciting, new, thornless dwarf blackberry that presents a fireworks-like display of large, juicy berries in the summer! Its compact habit makes it perfect for patio pots. In most regions, this blackberry will produce twice in one season. Produces on second-year canes. Self-fertile. 400 Chill hours.
Blueberry			
Tifblue	8'-10'	Jul	Dependable production with a large, light blue, flavorful berry. Cold hardy. Also wonderful as an ornamental hedge. Requires a pollinator, use Climax or Premier. Harvest in July. 550-700 chill hours.
Climax	8'-10'	May-Jul	Pretty shrub with blue-green foliage and tasty blue berries in summer. Requires acidic, well drained soil. Will grow in a partially shaded condition. Good plant for a large container. Berries are great eaten fresh or used for cooking, freezing, or preserves. Requires a pollinator, use Premier or Tifblue. 400-450 Chill hours.
Becky Blue	6'-8'	Apr-May	This variety of Rabbiteye blueberry will grow to be 6-8ft. These bushes will have white and pink blooms in early spring. Blueberry bushes grow best in soil that is acidic, and rich with organic matter. Fruit will ripen mid-spring to early summer. Plant with a pollinator for the best fruit production, use Climax, Premier or Tifblue. 350-400 Chill hours.
Jelly Bean	18"-24"	Jun-Jul	A compact cold hardy Blueberry, with rich green foliage. Elongated leaves will have red leaf margins in cooler weather. Jelly Bean produces large, sweet berries in mid-summer. Small size makes this blueberry perfect for container gardening. Self-fertile. 1,000 Chill hours.
Premier	4'-6'	May-June	Produces very sweet, large berries. Plant blueberries in a location where they will receive afternoon shade. Blueberries also have showy fall color in shades of red and orange. Harvest late May thru early June. Best production when planted with another variety like Climax or Tifblue. 500 Chill hours.
Bountiful Blue	3'-4'	Jun-Jul	Compact, rounded habit is perfect for use in the landscape or large containers. Blue tinged foliage with pink-blushed white flowers, produce a crop of large, sweet, juicy berries. Self fertile, 150-200 chill hours. Semi - evergreen in mild climates.
Blueberry Glaze	24"-36"	Jun-Jul	A new compact variety with nutrient-rich bundles of berries! Pink bell-shaped flowers produce an abundant summer crop of small, dark fruit with an intense wild blueberry flavor. Perfect on the patio in decorative containers. Mid-season producer. Can use some afternoon shade in hot climates. Self-fertile. 600 Chill hours.

Citrus

Kumquat Nagami	6'-8'	Oct-Dec	This small tree loads its dense branches with bright orange, delicate, tart tasting oval fruit, fall through midwinter. The rind is sweet and therefore the fruit is usually eaten whole. Very ornamental in containers or indoors in bright light.
Lemon Improved Mey	6'-8'	Sep-Oct	This superior variety can bloom and produce fruit several times a year. The fragrant white flowers, are followed by large, aromatic, orange-yellow lemons. The fruit is sweeter than other lemons and very juicy. Hardy to zone 9, this variety of lemon does well in containers.
Calamondin	6'-8'	Sep-Oct	Produces large quantities of a 1 inch fruit that resembles a small tangerine. They are very acidic, but can be used in marinades and to flavor beverages. The compact trees have waxy green foliage and are a great container specimen.
Satsuma Arctic Frost	6'-8'	Oct-Nov	Small, spreading, hardy Satsuma that is slightly more cold tolerant than other varieties, withstanding temperatures of 10 degrees F. May be grown in large container and can be brought indoors in colder climates. Juicy, nearly-seedless and easy-to-peel fruit ripens in winter.
Lime Persian or Bear	6'-8'	Oct-Dec	Named after John T. Bearss, who developed this nearly thornless and seedless variety around 1895. The fruit is oval-shaped, about the same size as a lemon, with a vivid green peel which turns yellow when ripe. Not cold hardy in the North Central Texas area, grow in a container so they can be protected from cold temperatures.
Grapefruit Oro Blanco	8'-10'	Sep-Nov	Oro Blanco is a cross between a sweet pummelo and a very seedy white grapefruit. The pale yellow flesh is sweet and the fruit is seedless. When ripe the Oro Blanco has a golden yellow peel with a thick rind.
Mandarin Clementine	8'-10'	Oct-Feb	An early season Mandarin producing sweet and juicy fruit that will hold on the tree for months. Easily peeled, highly ornamental fruits are held to the outside of the tree. Makes a beautiful landscape or container specimen.
Lime Kaffir	4'-6'		Kaffir lime leaves look like two leaves joined together, as one appears to grow from the tip of the other. The leaves are most often used as an essential ingredient for flavoring many Asian dishes such as soups, curries and fish. Because they produce very little juice, the juice and flesh of Kaffir limes is rarely used, but the sour-tasting rind can be finely grated and used for flavoring dishes.
Lemon New Zealand	6'-8'	Sep-Oct	Said to be a cross between a navel orange and a lemon. The fruit has a pale yellow rind and is relatively easy to peel. The low acid flesh has a sweet and tangy flavor, much like home-made lemonade.
Lemon Dwarf Improved	4'-6'	Sep-Nov	Great for growing in containers. 'Dwarf Improved Meyer' lemons are 'Improved Meyer' lemons that have been grafted onto a dwarf rootstock. They have the same great flavor as the 'Improved Meyer' lemon and are very prolific. The fruit turns a golden yellow when ripe and the flesh is sweet and juicy with low acidity.

Cultivar	Height	Harvest	Description
Kumquat Meiwa	6'-8'	Nov-Dec	Known as the Sweet Kumquat, Meiwa has golden-orange colored fruit. The highly fragrant blooms arrive in summer with fruit ripening during the winter months. The fruit is small and round, 'Meiwa' kumquats are best for fresh eating as both the skin and the pulp are edible. Hardy to 10 degrees Fahrenheit.
Mandarin Page	8'-10'	Oct-Feb	This is a cross between a 'Minneola' tangelo and a 'Clementine' mandarin also known as a "Tantangelo". The medium sized fruit has a slightly pebbled orange exterior. The flesh colour is a deep orange, tender and juicy with a sweet flavor. Protect from freezing weather.
Lemon Variegated Pi	6'-8'	Sep-Oct	A unique form of lemon with beautiful leaves edged in creamy white. The fruit is striped in yellow and green and the flesh is pink. Mature size in a container will be 6'-8' tall and wide. Hardy to zone 9. Should be protected from frost and freezing temperatures.
Lime Thornless Key	8'-10'	Oct-Dec	An upright, thornless tree, fruit is thin-skinned and has very few seeds. Key Lime trees make a great container grown or patio plant. Great for cooking or adding a special garnish to drinks. Hardy to Zone 9, must be protected from freezing temperatures.
Lemon Eureka Frost	10'-15'	Jun-Aug	An improved selection of the popular 'Eureka' variety with a sweeter flavor, cold hardy to zone 9 but can be grown in a container and brought in during the winter months. Produces large, sweet, juicy fruit with a yellow flesh and few seeds.
Orange Valencia	15'-20'	Oct-Nov	If you want fresh squeezed orange juice, then a Valencia orange is the one to plant. Considered a sweet orange they are juicier than most other varieties. The fruit is almost seedless with thin-skinned, deep golden rinds.
Orange Moro	8'-10'	Oct-Nov	The Moro is a Blood Orange with deep red flesh and a rind with a bright red blush. The flavor is sweet with a hint of raspberry. The flesh can range in color from orange-veined with ruby coloration, to vermilion, to vivid crimson, to nearly black.
Orange Vaniglia Sangre	8'-10'	Oct-Dec	This cultivar of the famous Blood Orange produces a purple-red fruit inside that is amazingly sweet and juicy. It blooms in late winter and spring with fruit ripening in fall and winter. Great for containers on your patio.
Satsuma Owari Frost	10'-15'	Nov-Dec	The flavor of the Owari Frost is sweet with just a hint of acidity. Very easy to peel and almost seedless, the red-orange rind incases the orange flesh.
Tangerine Sunburst	8'-10'	Oct-Dec	This tangerine gets its name from the "sunburst" shape on the stem end. The skin is dark orange, smooth and easy to remove. The flesh inside has few seeds with lots of juice and a very sweet flavor with a touch of acidity.
Grapefruit Rio Red	10'-15'	Sep-Nov	Rio Red Grapefruit is an improved form of older red-fleshed grapefruits, it is more cold-resistant and faster growing. The ripe fruit has pale-yellow skin with an attractive red flush. Cut it open and it is full of sweet, red flesh with very few seeds. Red-fleshed grapefruits are much sweeter than white-fleshed ones.

Fig

Brown Turkey	15'-20'	Jun	Also known as 'Texas Everbearing,' this fig with medium to large fruit with purplish-brown skin has rich, amber-pink flesh. Reliably good, sweet flavor best eaten fresh. Produces partially closed eye fruit late spring and late summer, with an outstanding winter hardiness. All figs are self fertile.
Celeste	15'-20'	Jun	Produces many small to medium-sized figs that ripen to green flushed with violet. Flesh is white, firm, juicy and very sweet. Most cold hardy fig. Good preserved and fresh. Figs are self fertile.
LSU Purple	10'-15'	Jun-Jul	Developed by LSU, this medium sized, red to dark purple fruit has amber to strawberry red flesh. A heavy, early yielder of closed eye fruit in July, they are often followed by a later fall crop. Very mild and sweet, it is great eaten fresh if picked a few days after turning black, wrinkled, and elongated. A vigorous, upright grower, it adapts to container culture, if protected from colder temperatures.
Black Italian	10'-15'	Jun-Jul	Fruit is nearly jet black with deep red pulp. Produces two distinct crops, an early crop on old wood and a late summer crop on new wood. Sweet and tasty eaten fresh. Self-fertile.
Little Miss Figgy	4'-6'	Aug-Sep	This dwarf fig will dazzle you with its deeply lobed, blue-green leaves and spectacular, dark purple fruits. Reaching 4 to 6 feet tall and 3 to 4 feet wide. Perfect for landscapes and containers.
Ischia	10'-15'	Jun-Jul	Ischia is a green-skinned fig with a closed eye. The large, sweet fruit can measure up to 2 inches in diameter. Inside color of the flesh is strawberry and the figs can be eaten fresh or dried to enjoy later. This fig variety can produce two crops a year, especially if it's grown in a warm location during the fall months to give the second crop time to ripen. When ripe the fruit is still green but somewhat puckered in appearance. All figs are self fertile.
Little Ruby	24"-36"	Jun-Jul	Suitable for containers, 'Little Ruby' has a natural dwarf habit with small, tasty, bite-sized, maroon-colored fruit. It produces an early, strong crop on the previous year's shoot growth. This new fig is cold hardy to zone 6 and great for patio plantings. All figs are self fertile.

Grape

Albemarle Muscadine	20'-30'	Aug-Sep	Albemarle is an all black Muscadine Grape that is classified as medium in size with excellent flavor. It matures early to mid season and has a high sugar content. Good for fresh eating, juices and jellies. Self fertile.
Blanc Du Bois	8'-10'	Jun-Jul	Vigorous vine, medium-sized clusters of 45 to 55 grapes. Ripens in late June through early July in South and East Texas. Matures at 8 to 10 feet tall and 10 to 12 feet wide. Pierce disease resistant. Makes an excellent accent.

Cultivar	Height	Harvest	Description
Black Spanish	4'-6'	Jul-Aug	Large clusters with small, black, seeded berries. Very vigorous, hardy, disease resistant grapes perfect for making red wine, jelly and juice. Thin skinned, dark purple grape with tender, juicy flesh. Heavily productive vines ripen late July-early August. Performs well in Dallas.
Champanel	10'-15'	Jul	Large, vigorous American hybrid black grape with high heat and drought tolerance. Resistant to most diseases and nematodes, and tolerant of alkaline soils. Well adapted to gardens in the South and Southwest. Great for jelly.
Scuppernong	20'-30'	Jul-Aug	Scuppernong is a variety of Muscadine Grapes that are native to the SE United States & have been cultivated for over 400 years by Native Americans (Scuppernong means 'Sweet Bay' in the Algonquin Indian's tongue.) These plump, round, green to bronze fruits bear a thick, tart skin and viscous, light, sweet pulp prized for juicing and making wine. Plant with a self-pollinating (female) variety for best fruit production.
Mars	6'-8'	Aug	A release from the University of Arkansas that tolerates hot summers. This seedless blue-skinned variety is also cold hardy and disease resistant. Excellent for juices, jellies, jams and eaten fresh. Self-fertile.
Carlos	20'-30'	Jun-Jul	The Carlos Muscadine is self-fertile with medium sized, good quality, bronze colored fruit. Ripens early-mid season. It leaves a clean scar on the fruit and is very productive. Excellent for making wine.
Cowart	20'-30'	Jun-Jul	The Cowart Muscadine produces large, deep blue-black grape clusters with a sweet flavor. One of the best and most productive varieties of Muscadines. Self fertile.
Reliance	4'-6'	Jun-Jul	Beautiful big, plump, rosy-red grapes that are sugar-sweet and perfect for snacking. Very productive and disease resistant. Self-fertile.
Neptune	6'-8'	Jun-Jul	A yellow-green seedless table grape, with mid-season uniform ripening. Produces large clusters with medium size, fruity and pleasant flavored berries similar to Thompson. Self-fertile.
Cabernet Franc	18"-24"	Aug	Small and precocious, from the Pixie™ series of dwarf grapevines. Produces dozens of clusters of sweet, low-seed, miniature grapes with thinner skin and lower acidity than Cabernet Sauvignon. Enjoy fresh off the vine, year-after-year, from the start. This easy-to-maintain, compact vine is perfect for urban patios and container gardens. Deciduous.
Pinot Meunier Purple	18"-24"	Aug	This small but precocious plant from the Pixie™ series produces dozens of miniature grape clusters, of the dark-berried variety most famously used in making Champagne. Delicious, sweet, nearly seedless grapes can be enjoyed fresh off the vine. Easy to maintain and perfect for the urban patio vineyard. Deciduous.
Pinot Meunier White	18"-24"	Aug	A true delight from the Pixie™ series of dwarf grapevines, with dozens of clusters of small, sweet, yellow grapes on a hardy, compact plant that is ideal for small spaces. Delicious, nearly seedless grapes, hold on the plant for months, perfect sweet treat to enjoy fresh off the vine. Ideal for an urban patio vineyard or container garden. Deciduous.
Riesling	18"-24"	Aug	A diminutive and delicious wine grape from the Pixie™ series of dwarf grapevines. The low maintenance, very compact vine produces a bounty of sweet, white Riesling grapes backed by lush, light green foliage. Enjoy fresh off the vine, year-after-year, from the start. Perfect for an urban patio vineyard or container garden. Deciduous.
Victoria Red	8'-10'	Jun-Jul	Victoria Red was designated a "Texas Superstar" by Texas A&M University in 2017. This established variety was recognized for its resilience, vigor and productivity as both an ornamental and edible plant. Victoria Red is a seeded grape with both large berries and clusters that are attractive and long with a bright red skin color. Excellent for making jams and jellies.

Arbequina	15'-20'	Nov	The Arbequina Olive tree rates high among olive connoisseurs because of its small size, good resistance to frosts and a high adaptability to different climates and soils (including poor ones).

Peach

White Zest One	15'-20'	Jun	New Texas A&M introduction. 'White Zest One' is a white fleshed, tangy-sweet, semi-freestone peach that yields in mid-June. Needs 550 chill hours. Self-fertile.
Ranger	15'-20'	Jun-Jul	Large, bright red-skinned freestone with sweet, yellow flesh. Very cold hardy and must be thinned to ensure large fruit. Fragrant pink flowers in spring. Self fertile. 800 chill hours.
Redskin	15'-20'	Aug	Produces firm yellow fleshed fruit with a deep red skin. Excellent flavor makes it perfect for eating fresh, storing or canning. Self fertile. 750 chill hours.
Loring	15'-20'	Jul	This self-pollinating peach tree produces beautiful pink blooms in spring and medium-to-large, freestone peaches. The low acid fruit is excellent for fresh eating, canning and preserves. Ripens early July; 750 chilling hours.
June Gold	15'-20'	May-Jun	June Gold is a large Semi-freestone peach with beautiful, red- blushed skin and golden-yellow flesh. Great for canning or fresh eating. Self-fertile; 600 chill hours.
Bonfire Dwarf	6'	Jun-Jul	Bonfire is a genetic dwarf, growing to only 6 feet, with showy flowers and reddish new foliage. The fruit is large, freestone with orange-red skin and sweet yellow flesh. Excellent planted in large containers. Midseason bearing. Harvest in Summer. 250 -350 chill hours
Royal Zest Four	15'-20'	Jun-Jul	Royal Zest Four has a tangy-sweet taste with yellow flesh and is a semi-freestone peach. Yields in mid-late June. Needs 600 chill hours.

White Delight Two	10'-15'	Jun	A semi-freestone, white fleshed peach. Low acidity with a sweet flavor. Ripens in mid-June. Self-fertile. 500 Chill Hours
Tex Prince	10'-15'	May-Jun	A tangy-sweet, yellow flesh, freestone peach. Yields in late May. Self fertile. 550 chill hours.
Royal Zest Two	15'-20'	Jun	Royal Zest Two has a tangy-sweet taste with yellow flesh and is a semi-freestone peach. Yields in early June. Needs 500 chill hours.
White Delight Four	15'-20'	June	White Delight Four has a firm, low-acid fruit with a white flesh. The flavor is sweet and juicy making them a good choice for fresh eating. Fruit is medium to large depending on the number of fruit left on the tree. Ripens in early June and needs 550 chill hours.

Pear

Moonglow	20'-30'	Aug	A wonderful, large, brownish-green skin pear with mild, juicy flesh and little grit. Bears at early age and is self-fertile. It is fireblight resistant, and an excellent pollinator. 500 chill hours.
Kieffer	15'-20'	Sep-Oct	Medium to large fruit with a gritty texture that makes it perfect for canning and cooking. High tolerance to heat and cold, disease resistant and long lived. 300 - 400 chill hours. Self-fertile.
Orient	10'-15'	Sep-Oct	A yellow, European pear with mild, juicy flesh, named for its resemblance to the Asian pear with its smooth texture. Producing in August, it can be eaten fresh or canned. Requires pollination from a European variety, such as 'Kieffer', or 'Moonglow'. 400 chill hours.
Chojuro	15'-20'	Aug-Sep	A popular variety of Asian pear known for its butterscotch flavor. Green- to yellow-brown russeted skin surrounds crisp, juicy, flavorful white flesh. Pick when first yellow-brown in color. Ripens in late August. Requires 500 chill hours and needs a pollinator, any other Asian pear will work.
Shinko	15'-20'	Aug-Sep	This Asian pear has fruit that is medium to large with a brown to golden brown russet color. Flesh is yellowish white with a good juicy, sweet flavor. Fruit quality is very good to excellent. Tree is of medium size, average vigor and a heavy bearer. Ripens mid-late September. Requires 450 chill hours and needs a pollinator, any other Asian pear will work.

Pecan

Choctaw	60'+	Nov	Nuts are very large and rich in flavor with a high oil content. Well adapted to our area. Bears good crops of papershell pecans. Keep moist until well established, then water as necessary and during drought periods. Plant with a Type I variety such as Desirable for best cross pollination.
Desirable	60'+	Sep-Oct	Disease resistant variety, well-adapted to Texas. Consistent bearer of medium-large, papershell pecans. Keep moist until well established, then water as necessary and during drought periods. Plant with a Type II variety like Choctaw for best cross pollination.
Elliot	60'+	Nov	This pecan variety is chosen as a top performer in southern landscapes. Excellent quality, medium-sized nuts with medium-thick shells. To get the highest yield plant with another pecan variety like Desirable for cross pollination.

Persimmon

Fuyu	20'-30'	Nov	Handsome tree with edible fruit and bright fall color. Medium sized persimmons are red with flat cap that ripen in late fall. Non-astringent fruit on a self-fertile tree.
Hachiya	20'-30'	Nov	Large, heart-shaped, seedless fruit with bright orange-red skin. Best cooking quality with an astringent taste. Great ornamental tree that's upright and vigorous. Needs a pollinator.
Tanenashi	20'-30'	Oct	A rounded tree that is a prolific producer of medium-sized round to cone-shaped orange-red fruits. The flesh is yellow when ripe and has a dry texture which some people prefer. Self-fertile with harvest time beginning in the fall.
Saijo	10'-15'	Sep-Oct	Saijo is claimed to be the sweetest and best tasting of the persimmons. The elongated medium sized fruit is a beautiful yellow-orange color. Self-fertile.
Chocolate	15'-20'	Oct-Nov	A highly productive tree producing medium to small, elongated fruit. Very tasty, sweet brown flesh that is non-astringent when ripe. Foliage is bright lime green in early spring turning to a darker green in summer with orange fall foliage. Fruit ripens in late October to early November. Self-fertile.

Plum

Bruce	10'-15'	May-Jun	Large fruit, with red skin and flesh. Great for fresh eating and jams. Bears at an early age and requires a pollinator such as Methley. 800 chill hours.
Methley	10'-15'	Jun	Medium sized, juicy, sweet, red-purple fruit. Excellent fresh and in jams. Beautiful clusters of white flowers in early spring followed by bright green foliage. Self-fertile, can be used as a pollinator. 250 chill hours.
Santa Rosa	10'-15'	Jun-Jul	This early season plum is a medium-large, crimson to purplish red, lightly freckled plum with yellow flesh. The fruit is firm, sweet, juicy, and aromatic. Compact vigorous tree. Self pollinating. 450 chill hours.
Ozark Premier	15'-20'	Jun-Jul	Cold-hardy selection produces red-skinned fruits with juicy, firm, yellow flesh. Excellent for canning, pies, and eating out-of-hand. 800 chill hours. Needs a pollinator.
Autumn Rosa	10'-15'	Sep	Autumn Rosa produces medium to large, heart-shaped fruit. Purplish-red skin with amber cast. Flesh is yellow streaked with red. Excellent flavor. Fruit ripens over a long period of time, Early to Late September. Holds well on tree. Self-fertile. 500 chilling hours.
