CL Cecile Brunner !	Pink	1894. Polyantha Climber. Clusters of small pointed pastel pink buds open to reveal creamy pink blooms with a moderate tea fragrance. Blooms heaviest in spring on old wood, some reblooming in the fall. Petal count 25-40.
CL Lady Banks Yellow !	Yellow	1824. Species. Thornless climber with clusters of fragrant, small double yellow flowers. Spring blooming only. Petal count 26-40.
CL Peggy Martin !	Pink	UNK. Climber. Famous rose that survived Hurricane Katrina. Blooms throughout the growing season on nearly thornless canes. Petal count 15-25.
CL Zepherine Drouhin !	Cerise Pink	1868. Thornless climber that blooms a beautiful cerise-pink in spring and fall with a strong bourbon fragrance. Petal count 15-25.
Cramoisi Superieur !	Crimson	1832. China. Low-growing shrub with clusters of blooms all summer. Sweet, fruity fragrance. Petal count 15-25.
Dame De Coeur !	Crimson	1958. Early Hybrid Tea. Large, double blooms darken with age. Excellent for cutting. Petal count 25-40.
Maggie !	Violet	UNK. Shrub. A found rose with highly fragrant flowers, blooms through summer and has rose hips in fall. Petal count 25-40.
Marchesa Boccella !	Pink	1842. Hybrid Perpetual. Clusters of delicate, pink, multi-petaled blooms sit atop jade green foliage. True to it's classification, this rose seems to be in perpetual bloom. Intense rose fragrance. Petal count 40 plus.
Marie Pavie !	Cream	1888. Polyantha. Nearly thornless rose. Musk fragrance. Pink buds open to clusters of creamy white blooms. Petal count 15-25.
Martha Gonzales !	Scarlet	1984. China. A found rose that is a continuous show of single petal blooms. Disease resistant. Petal count 15-25.
Mermaid !	Yellow	1918. Climber. Fragrant, large, single flowers. Repeats best once established. Petal count 5-7.
Nacogdoches !	Yellow	UNK. Found rose believed to be in the Floribunda class. Eye-catching, bright yellow pointed blooms are great for cutting. Also called 'Grandma's Yellow'. Reblooming and fragrant. Petal count 25-40.
Sombreuil !	White	1850. Tea. Creamy-white blooms are very large, flat, and quartered, with a most delicious tea rose fragrance. This mannerly climber is ideally suited for use as a pillar rose, or training on a low wall, fence, or trellis. Petal count 40 plus.

Abraham Darby !	Apricot	Large, cup-shaped blooms in shades of apricot, yellow and pink. A repeat bloomer with a rich, fruity fragrance. Petal count 70.
Benjamin Britten !	Reddish Pink	The unique shade of deep red-pink makes this rose glow in the landscape. Large rosette-shaped blooms with an intense fruity fragrance. May be trained as a climber. Petal count 60.
Boscobel * !	Salmon	Blooms have a classic rosette form with a rich salmon coloring. Fragrance is a medium strong myrrh with hints of pear and almond. Petal count 78.
Carding Mill	Apricot	Large blooms in shades of pink, apricot and yellow. Strong, beautiful myrrh fragrance. Repeats well. Enjoys warmer climates. Petal count 80.
Charlotte	Yellow	Sumptuous soft yellow, cup-shaped blooms with a delicious tea rose fragrance. Excellent repeat flowering and good disease resistance. Petal count 100.
Darcey Bussell * !	Crimson	Deep crimson rosettes with a delightful fruity fragrance. An exceptional variety which flowers freely and repeats well. Compact, bushy growth. Petal count 70.
Desdemona !	White	Pink buds open to beautiful, pure white blooms, with an attractive hint of pink at the earliest stage of flowering. Strong old rose fragrance. Petal count 52.
Gertrude Jekyll *	Pink	Large rosettes of rich, glowing pink. Strong well-balanced old rose fragrance. Maybe trained as a climber. Repeat flowering. Petal count 80.
Golden Celebration	Gold	Large golden blooms have a strong tea fragrance with a hint of strawberry. Forms a rounded, arching shrub or may be used as a climber. Repeat flowering. Petal count 70.

Graham Thomas	Yellow	Rich yellow cup-shaped blooms with a strong, fresh tea fragrance. Voted the World's Favorite Rose by the World Federation of Rose Societies. May be grown as a large shrub or trained as a climber. Repeat flowering. Petal count 45.
Lady Emma Hamilton *	Tangerine	Ruby-red buds open to reveal double, cupped flowers of tangerine-orange blooms. Intense fruity fragrance with hints of pear, grape and citrus. Forms an upright, bushy shrub that is a repeat bloomer. Petal count 45.
Lady of Shalott *	Apricot	Striking apricot-yellow, chalice-shaped blooms. Healthy with vigorous, bushy growth. Ideal for inexperienced gardeners. Mild tea fragrance with hints of apples and cloves. Repeat flowering with good disease resistance. Petal count 60.
Lichfield Angel * !	Cream	Vigorous rounded shrub with apricot buds, that open to reveal creamy white, dome-shaped blooms. Light, spicy scent. Repeat flowering. Petal count 100.
Molineux * !	Yellow	Rich yellow, rosette-shaped flowers with a musky, tea rose fragrance. Upright growth habit and exceptional blooming. Repeat flowering. Winner of three awards. Petal count 120.
Munstead Wood * !	Crimson	Light crimson buds open to reveal large cup-shaped blooms with velvety, deep crimson centers. Strong old rose fragrance with unertones of blackberry and blueberry. Named after Gertrude Jekyll's garden in Surrey. Petal count 74.
Olivia Rose Austin !	Pale Pink	A lovely soft shade of pink with a strong, pleasing, fruity fragrance. The growth is vigorous and it repeat flowers well. One of the most disease-resistant varieties of English roses. Petal count 90.
Princess Alexandra of Kent * !	Pink	Flowers are full-petaled and deeply cupped. The center of the bloom is a glowing pink ringed by outer petals of pale pink. Delicious tea fragrance with hints of lemon and black currant as the blooms age. Repeat flowering. Petal count 130.
Scepter'd Isle' * !	Pink	Soft pink blooms open to reveal clusters of golden stamens. Lovely 'English Rose' myrrh scent. Repeat flowering. Petal count 45.
Teasing Georgia !	Yellow	Beautifully formed golden yellow blooms with a lovely, strong tea fragrance. An easy to grow English climber for your rose garden. Shows good disease resistance and repeat flowering. Petal count 110.
The Generous Gardener	Pale Pink	Delicate, cup-shaped, pale pink blooms. Strong old rose, musk and myrrh scent. Repeat flowering.
The Lady Gardener	Apricot	Large, full petalled, rich apricot blooms. Strong and delicious tea fragrance. Repeat flowers quickly.
Tranquillity * !	White	Pure white blooms with a light apple fragrance. Almost thornless, repeat bloomer with good disease resistance. Petal count 110.

Belinda's Dream	Pink	Climbing Belinda's Dream' is a climbing sport of the popular EarthKind® rose, Belinda's Dream. This rose is very vigorous to 20 feet and has fragrant, three inch, medium pink flowers blooming mostly in the spring. Petal count 45 plus.
Cloud 10 *	White	Huge pure white, fully double, cuplike blooms have an exotic musk like scent. This modern climber shows good disease resistance and will rebloom throughout the season. Blooms on old and new wood. Petal count 50-60.
Colette	Pink	Soft pink, citrus scented blooms cover this hybrid climber. Blooms on old and new wood. Petal count 20-25.
Don Juan	Red	Favored by rosarians and gardeners alike for more than half a century. Dark, red, fragrant flowers will cover this rose once established. Blooms on old and new wood. Petal count 30-35.
Highwire Flyer !	Hot Pink	New for 2018. Strong, vibrant hot pink, blooms on a bushy climber. Repeat blooming. Petal count 20.
Iceberg	White	An excellent climbing rose with sprays of medium-sized, white flowers that exude a mild honey fragrance. Good repeat flowering, blooms on old wood only. Petal count 20-25.
Joseph's Coat	Yellow/Red	Colorful blooms of yellow & scarlet. Good repeat bloom. Blooms on old & new wood. Petal count 23-28.
Lady in Red	Dark Red	Clusters of old fashioned, double ruffled blooms are dark red suffused with an occasional black smoke. Reblooms throughout the season with a light tea fragrance. Blooms on old and new wood. Petal count 35-50.
Pearly Gates *	Pearl Pink	Large, full, pearl pink blooms with a strong spice and rose scent. Free flowering, blooms on old and new wood. Petal count 30-35.
Red Cascade !	Red	Climber. Profuse bloomer covered in one-inch red flowers. Petal count 15-25.
Sky's the Limit *	Yellow	Clusters of buttery-yellow blooms on a free flowering climber, with a light fruity fragrance. Reblooming even in the first season. Petal count 20-25.
Tropical Lightning *	Orange/Cream	Clusters of sunset-like orange blooms with a creamy white stripe that hold their color for days after opening. Moderate fruity, apple-like fragrance. Petal count 20-30.
Westerland	Orange	Large sprays of brightly colored orange blossoms have a strong spice and rose scent. Blooms on both old and new wood. Good repeat bloomer. Petal count 18-25.
White Dawn	White	Clusters of white, ruffled blooms on a vigorous plant. Sweet rose fragrance. Blooms on old and new wood. Petalcount 30-35.

Carefree Beauty !	Pink	This vigorous, upright shrub rose sports smooth, olive-green leaves and clusters of cup-shaped, semi-double, fragrant, bubble-gum pink flowers from spring to fall. Also known as 'Katy Road Pink'. A Griffith Buck introduction. Petal Count 16-20.
CL New Dawn	Pink	Climbing. Hardy and vigorous. Large, fragrant pale pink flowers that bloom on old and new wood. Petal count 35-40.
Climbing Pinkie !	Rose	Polyantha Climber. Rose pink, cupped shaped blooms are produced in clusters with great profusion. The nearly thornless canes are easy to work with when training it as a climber. Fragrant and reblooming. Petal count 15-25.
Ducher !	White	1869. China. The only white China. The buds are very round and sometimes have a hint of pink on the outer petals opening to a delicate swirl of fragrant ivory petals. Smaller than many Chinas, this is a good candidate for a container. Petal count 25-40.
Duchesse de Brabant !	Pink	1857. Tea. Very fragrant cupped, pink blooms. Good repeat flowering with some hips to follow in the fall. Petal count 25-40.
Knock Out *!	Red	Single cherry red flowers bloom throughout the growing season. Petal count 7-11.
Marie Daly !	Pink	Polyantha. A sport of 'Marie Pavie' with clusters of medium pink, double flowers all season long. Fragrant, repeat blooming and almost thornless. Petal count 15-25.
Mme. Antoine Mari !	Pink	1901. Tea. Fragrant flowers that fade to cream. Blooms almost non-stop. Full rounded growth habit. Petal count 15-40.
Mutabilis !	Yellow & Red	Prior to 1894. China. All season bloom. Colors change from yellow to orange to red and finally crimson. Also known as the "Butterfly rose." Petal count 5-7.
The Fairy !	Pink	Shrub. Profuse clusters of small, double, pink flowers with a pleasant apple scented fragrance. Very profuse bloom habit, repeats well. Petal count 20-25.

Apricot Drift * !	Apricot	Double apricot flowers bloom spring through fall. Best for small gardens or along pathways. Petal count 30-35.
Coral Drift * !	Coral	Covered in small, semi double coral blooms and has a compact rounded growth habit. Petal count 20-25.
Peach Drift * !	Peach	Pretty peach blooms on a compact rounded form. Petal count 15-20.

Brick House !	Deep Bright Red	Clusters of deep, bright red blooms repeat throughout the season. Shows good disease resistance. Petal count 10-12.
Celestial Night *	Plum/Raspberry	New for 2019. Old-fashioned cup-shaped and quartered blooms in a plum-purple color with a raspberry reverse are backed by dark glossy green foliage. Mildly fragrant with good disease resistance. Petal count 60-75.

Cinco De Mayo * !	Coral/Magenta	2009 AARS Winner. Clusters of unusually colored blooms that are shades of coral, red, magenta and purple with a smoky touch. Sweet apple fragrance. Petal count 25.
Easy Does It *	Apricot/Peach	2010 AARS Winner. Clusters of apricot & honey-peach colored blooms with a fruity scent. The individual petals have scalloped edges. Petal count 25-30.
Easy Going *	Apricot/Yellow	Large glowing blooms of golden apricot-yellow with a light fruity fragrance. Good disease resistance and repeat flowering. Petal count 25-30.

Livin' Easy * !	Apricot	AARS 1996 Winner. Loads of bright and bold orange, semi-double 3 1/2" blooms that have a spicy clove scent are borne on a repeat blooming plant. Petal count 25-30.
Plum Perfect *	Purple/Lavender	From the Sunbelt® series of roses by Kordes, this floribunda has very double, plum colored blooms with a compact growth habit. Performs well in heat and humidity. Petal count 70-75.
Rosie the Riveter	Orange Blend	Unusual flowers of orange-gold suffused with pink have a moderately fruity scent with spicy undertones. Petal count 30-45.
Scentimental *	Red & White	The red and white swirl of colors is different on each bloom, no two blooms are the same. Add the sweet and spicy scent and you get a truly unique rose. Petal count 25-30.
Sparkle and Shine * !	Yellow	Clusters of bright yellow fade resistant blooms on a rounded bushy plant. Repeat blooming with a light fruit fragrance. Petal count 30-35.
Trumpter	Red Orange	Long lasting red-orange, ruffled blossoms stand out against glossy green foliage. Good disease resistance on a compact, bushy plant. Petal count 35-40.
Violet's Pride	Lavender	'Downton Abbey' Collection. Named after Lady Violet, the Dowager Countess of Grantham this rose bears clusters of medium-large, 3½-4 inch diameter blooms with a spicy citrus fragrance. Petal count 35-45.

**Antique Roses**

These Old Garden roses are naturally disease resistant, hardier and require less care than most other roses. Garden roses are generally very fragrant and adaptable to a variety of landscape situations. They have many classifications ranging from dwarfs to cluster blooms to climbers and everything in between.

**David Austin English Roses**

These roses bring the romance and charm of the roses of years past to your garden. Their blooms are packed with layers of petals, appealing fragrances and soft coloring.

**Climbing Roses**

Many of our modern rose climbers originated from hybrid teas that have a tendency to grow unusually long canes. Climbers can grow to a length of 18 to 20 feet and bloom as profusely as many hybrid teas. Unlike other types of roses, climbers are not pruned heavily each spring. They should be selectively pruned after the first flush of blooms.

**Florascape Roses**

These hardy spreading roses quickly cover large areas creating a carpet of low maintenance color ideal for slopes and rocky areas. Great in baskets for trailing color.

**Floribunda Roses**

This type of rose began as a cross between Polyantha and hybrid tea. The cross was such a success that an entire new call of rose was named. These shrubs reach 2 ½ to 3 ½ feet in height, with dense branching. They are free blooming with small blooms in large clusters.

**Grandiflora Roses**

Queen Elizabeth, when it was introduced in 1955, was clearly an extraordinary rose. However, it did not fit any of the already existing classifications. It was, therefore, given the distinction of naming a rose category for it. This type usually ranges from 4 ½ feet upward with long stems sometimes supporting several blooms, but slightly smaller than hybrid tea. Most Grandiflora shrubs support a heavy compliment of blooms throughout the growing season and are an excellent source of flowers.

**Hybrid Tea Roses**

This is the best type for cut flowers since each stem has only one bloom. Bushes grow 3 ½ to 4 ½ feet tall and get bigger in ideal conditions. The Hybrid Tea is the most popular type of rose sold in America.

**Miniature Roses**

These roses are small in stature but are prolific bloomers. They generally do not exceed 2 feet tall and bloom continuously with small flowers. They are extremely low maintenance and are great for containers.

**Shrub/Hedge Roses**

These roses are easy-care, versatile and fragrant. They adapt well to many soils and temperatures. They have colorful hips throughout winter.

**Texas Pioneer Roses**

These roses are the result of crosses between some of Dr. Robert Basye's disease resistant varieties and David Austin's English Roses, Hybrid Perpetuals, Hybrid Teas and other large-flowering shrub roses. The roses are named for various people and places important to Texas heritage. You will find them to be beautiful, resilient and tough, much like the early Texas pioneers they honor.
